



### Growing the rural church:

A summary of research into rural church dispels the myth that faith in the countryside is dwindling.

'Shaping strategies for mission and growth in rural multi-church groups'

However, it makes clear that growth requires everyone to bring their skills to the church.

Archbishop Justin Welby sounds a chilling warning: "any church that leaves things to the 'professionals' is committing missionary suicide."

In other words, we – the whole people of the churches that make up the Papworth Team – have to hear the words of St Paul which reminds us that each of us forms part of Christ's body in this place and this age.

'We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us' (Rom 12:6)

So what are the top tips that this new report suggests. It says that growth in rural churches is associated with 'six particular characteristics':

- 1. an intentional focus on mission and evangelism, beyond a focus on Sunday worship;
- 2. a culture of personal and corporate discipleship within congregations;
- 3. a committed group of lay people leading a range of activities and events, with easily accessible training and support available;
- 4. a redirection of time and energy, particularly but not exclusively for clergy, from administration and building maintenance to outreach, service and evangelism;
- 5. an approach to ordained ministry in which discerning, nurturing and equipping the ministry of lay people within the body of Christ is one of the highest-priority areas of work for the clergy, backed up by appropriate training and support;
- 6. co-operation and collaboration within and between different multi-church groups, and ecumenically wherever possible.

Our team has many lay people playing their part, from cleaning to leading worship.

Have you thought what your gifts may be? It does not have to be high profile, it need not take up lots of time. But as one of our supermarkets reminds us every day: 'Every little helps'.

### **Merchant Navy Day:**



Eltisley History Society have received details of Merchant Navy Day, held annually on 3rd September. Are you aware of this annual commemoration? Seafarers UK are trying to raise public awareness of Merchant Navy Day and of our ongoing reliance on seafarers and shipping, and we would like to encourage you to spare a thought, particularly on 3rd September, for the sacrifices made by British Merchant Navy seafarers.

Admiral The Right Honourable The Lord West of Spithead, GCB, DSC, PC, writes in his Foreword to the Seafarers UK appeal: "While many people know that the 3rd of September 1939 marked the outbreak of the Second World War, few are aware that it also marks the first major British maritime casualty, the merchant vessel SS Athenia, torpedoed just a few hours after hostilities were declared with the loss of 128 passengers and crew. Although many hundreds of merchant ships and thousands of seafarers would meet the same fate in the years to come, 3rd September is now enshrined as 'Merchant Navy Day' to honour the brave men and women who kept our island nation afloat during both World Wars, and even during peacetime faced – and continue to face – the more routine perils of violent storms and mountainous seas."

The total recorded losses for the First World War were 2479 ships and 14287 seamen, plus vessels of the Fishing Fleet and 434 seamen; these were just those who died at sea.

The Seafarers UK campaign is encouraging parish, town and community councils across the UK to fly the Red Ensign, the official flag of the British Merchant Navy, to show support for the initiative and to publicly recognise the debt we owe Merchant Navy seafarers. Eltisley History Society would like to ask you to remember the sacrifices made and think about those who are lost and those who continue to serve in the Merchant Navy.



## ROGER'S RAMBLINGS



It really is great to see the traditional Feast Week taking place on our beautiful village green, cricket each day, evening events and the Fete, well done to all involved, and thanks to the 10 stalwart volunteers who attended the village working party by doing odd jobs around the village we help to keep the precept down, have a bit of fun and, of course, Pat's celebrated cakes!

I apologise that the Parish Plan Survey failed to appear last month, the District Council printers were late delivering it but it will be circulated soon so look out for it and <u>please</u> fill it in. I have had many positive comments on the parking trial in Caxton End and we await feedback from Cambridgeshire Highways, the only proviso being extending the parking restriction into the Green Road to improve visibility.

At the July PC meeting we discussed the Housing Needs Survey which indicated the need for 10 affordable homes, and we will continue to work with Cambridgeshire ACRE, South Cambs District Council and Hastoe Housing to find a suitable site. The survey results are available from SCDC and also on our website. We reviewed the specification for paths and driveways that cross the green and I reported on the Police Panel meeting following which we resolved to request that our designated Sergeant attend our next meeting to discuss our concerns on crime in the village.

Accounts were approved for payment, we noted the bank reconciliation and internal audit, and appointed an internal auditor for 2017/18. We heard the latest advice from CAPALC on dealing with the pond at the end of Manor Farm drive and the funds from the sale of the village institute, and, following comments from our insurers and ROSPA, we decided not to proceed with lighting the play area on the green. We approved planning applications for rebuilding the wall at 18 the Green, treatments of timber infestation at 1 Potton End and an extension to 3 Caxton End, but we objected to an application for a disabled parking bay in Greenfields on the basis that it would cause further congestion.

The meeting was closed to the public to allow us to review the clerk's annual appraisal, and we then moved onto a meeting of the EVGT where we agreed to fund the new football goal, and a meeting of the Eltisley Allotments for the Labouring Poor – yes that's the proper title! – as our auditors have advised us to hold a separate meeting for it, after approving the accounts and noting the account balances, we concluded a busy night.

Please do remember that harvest has started – and the school holidays begun. The machinery gets bigger all the time so please keep your children safe, and bear in mind that the concrete road that turns right before the bridleway to Caxton is a Private Road for the use of farm traffic only.

The PC Minutes and other information are posted on the PC notice Board in the bus shelter, and there is lots of information on our village website – www.eltisleyvillage.co.uk do check it out.

Our next PC meeting will be at **The Cade Pavilion** on **Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> September** at **7.30pm.** See you there.

### A message from Elaine Mountford, Community Protection Officer:

I am pleased to say that a large percentage of Cambridgeshire's No Cold Calling Zones are now led by a local resident which is fantastic news and our Good Neighbours Scheme is also proving popular with over 30 schemes now in place across Cambridgeshire. Welcome to our new coordinators and thank you all for your help. I hope these updates are proving useful to you all.

Be wary of people calling you claiming to be from The Telephone (or Mailing) Preference Service asking for payment to complete your registration. TPS/MPS is a FREE service. TPS have also been made aware of an overseas company claiming to be BT, asking for your credit card details to stop unwanted calls. This is a scam. BT advise on their website to never give out your credit card details over the phone.

We have also had a message from the Action Fraud team warning of a text message scam. This is known as 'smishing' (SMS phishing!). It enables criminals to steal a victim's money or identity, or both, as a result of a response to a text message. Fraudsters are targeting victims via text message, purporting to be from their credit card provider, stating a transaction has been approved on their credit card. The text message further states to confirm if the transaction is genuine by replying 'Y' for Yes or 'N' for No. Do not respond to these messages (or to text 'stop' to a strange number to stop text messages). Through this method the fraudster would receive confirmation of the victim's active telephone number and would be able to engage further by asking for the victim's credit card details, CVV number (the three digits on the back of your bank card) and/or other personal information.

### Protect yourself:

- Always check the validity of the text message by contacting your credit card provider through the number provided at the back of the card or on the credit card/bank statement.
- Beware of cold calls purporting to be from banks and/or credit card providers.
- If the phone call from the bank seems suspicious, hang up the phone and wait for 10 minutes
  before calling the bank back. Again, refer to the number at the back of the card or on
  the bank statement in order to contact your bank.
- If you have been a victim of fraud or cyber-crime, please report it to Action Fraud at
   http://www.actionfraud.police.uk/ or alternatively by calling 0300 123 2040
